
Col. Harry A. Ficken, Jr. "Andy" Corpus Christi, TX

Col. Harry A. Ficken, Jr. USA (ret.), aka Andy, passed away on Tuesday, December 3, 2013. Andy was born on December 16, 1928 in Asheville, North Carolina. He attended Wofford College in Spartenburg, South Carolina. After

completing the ROTC program, he was called to active duty as a 2nd Lt. in the Infantry, and sent to Korea in 1952. He returned to college at Hardin Simmons University in Abilene, Texas and received his BBA degree in 1959. He was released from active duty and assigned to the active duty reserve. Andy then went to work for the Treasury Department and was assigned to the Corpus Christi area. He remained in the Active Reserve. When the Vietnam War broke out, he was recalled to active duty as a Major, sent back to Fort Benning, Texas and then on to Vietnam. While in RVN, he was awarded 3 Bronze Stars, The Air Medal, The Army Commendation Medal, The Combat Infantry Badge, The Vietnam Cross of Gallantry w/ Palm, The Vietnamese Service Medal, and the US RVN Medal. After a series of other tours of duty, Col. Ficken was assigned as Provost Marshall Three Corps and Fort Hood, and for their actions he and his MP's were awarded the Humane Action Medal. Ultimately Andy retired with 34 years of honorable service.

After retirement, Andy kept busy as a marine surveyor and private investigator. Being an avid sailor, Andy and his wife, Teri, were constants on the racing scene in their boat 'Warrior', and then when sailing became too much, they were often seen on the water on their trawler 'We'll Sea'. Andy was a long-time member of the Corpus Christi Yacht Club and Past Commodore of the Bay Yacht Club. In October 2010, Andy was bestowed with the honor of becoming an Admiral in the Texas Navy, an honor he greatly cherished.

Andy is survived by his wife, Teri; daughter, Kathrine; two grandchildren, Melissa & Justin; his brother, Chuck Ficken (Alice) of Winston-Salem, N.C.; brother-in-law, Tony Feher of New York City; and two of the best friends imaginable, Robin & Alan Dinn. He also leaves behind a nephew, David Ficken (Kerry) of Raleigh, North Carolina; and numerous cousins in both North Carolina and Texas. His friends were many and he will be sorely missed. 


